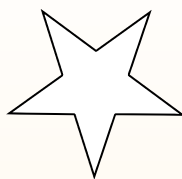

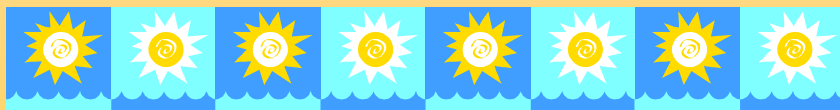

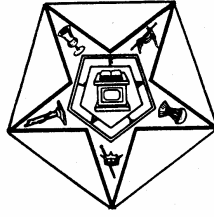

IN MEMORIAM

Ivan I. Taylor

Worthy Grand Patron of the Grand Chapter of Idaho
Order of the Eastern Star
1984 – 1985

With deepest sorrow we announce the death of Past Grand Patron Brother Ivan I. Taylor, on Wednesday, June 4, 2008, in Mackay, Idaho. Services were held Saturday, June 7th at the Mackay Masonic Lodge.

Brother Ivan was born at White Knob, Idaho on August 2, 1918. He entered the Civilian Conservation Corp at sixteen and served one year. Ivan entered the military in May 1942 and was honorably discharged in October 1945 as a Master Sergeant. He was awarded the Soldier's Medal, Bronze Star, Good Conduct Medal and four campaign stars. Five years later Brother Ivan was called back to duty and served in the Korean War. Mining was his passion and he spent most of his life as a hard rock miner.

Brother Ivan was initiated and Entered Apprentice in Mt. McCaleb Lodge No. 64 on June 18, 1959. He was raised to Master Mason on August 18, 1959. On May 10, 1960 Brother Ivan was initiated into Harmony Chapter No. 44 where he served at least eleven terms as Worthy Patron. He was a 48 year member of Harmony Chapter.

Brother Ivan assisted Worthy Grand Matron Janet Jensen during her 1984-1985 term and during their "Light of the Angels" Session at Lewis and Clark State College in Lewiston, Idaho. During his term as Worthy Grand Patron, Brother Ivan's daughter Kathy Burroughs and her husband Bob were Worthy Matron and Worthy Patron of Harmony Chapter. They were also Worthy Matron and Worthy Patron during the 1985 Grand Chapter Session as they were re-elected to those stations.

Brother Ivan invested much of his life serving others. During his term as Worthy Grand Patron, he was a Custer County Commissioner and Chairman of the Board of Commissioners. He also served as Mayor of Mackay, in many other civic organizations and recently, the Lost Rivers Medical Hospital Foundation.

Our sympathy is extended to his family - wife Myrna, daughter and son-in-law Kathy and Bob Burroughs, sister Roberta Skelton, Myrna's children Dawn (Gary) Jensen, Shawn (Mary) Roberts and Chanelle (Dave) Foltz; and grandchildren and great-grandchildren.

As a tribute of love and respect to our departed Brother, let this memorial be read in each subordinate chapter not later than the second stated meeting following its receipt and the Altar be draped.


