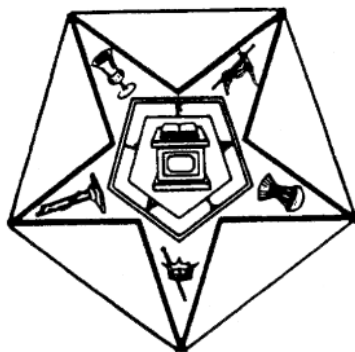

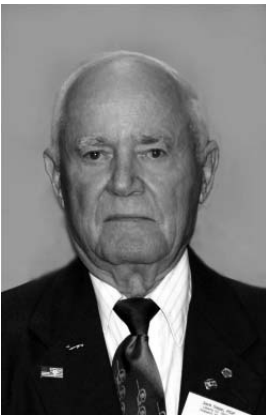

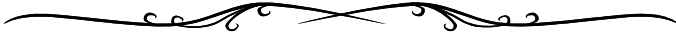

Might we be lifted up, might our hearts be encouraged as we look to You. We pray this in Jesus' name. Amen.

WGM: I would like to welcome each one of you to this Sunday Morning Worship Service. It is fitting that we begin this Grand Chapter with worship. It gives us time to reflect on our own lives and remember why we are members of the Order of the Eastern Star.

WGP: Sisters, Brothers and Friends, welcome. This morning we will sing praises and hear the word of the Lord, give scholarships to those studying religious leadership, and remember those who have passed to that undiscovered country from which no traveler returns since we last gathered.

WGM: At this time I would like to introduce Brother Dwain Valez, Past Patron of Pend d'Orielle Chapter No. 62 in Priest River and Grand Representative of Georgia who will lead the devotional service. Brother Dwain was born in December, 1933 in Minneapolis, MN. He graduated from Bible college in Los Angeles, California in 1957. He married his wife Shirlee in 1956; they have six children, seventeen grandchildren, and seven great-grandchildren. Brother Dwain has pastored in California, Washington and Idaho. He and Shirley have resided in Priest River for forty years. He says his goal in life is "to serve those in need and communicate the Bible in an understandable manner."

Dwain Valez PP (62): It's a great honor and privilege to be here this morning. I became a member of the Order of the Eastern Star about six years ago. I have been impressed all along that way with the relationship that Eastern Star has to the Word of God and to the principles of scripture. I think it's commendable that you honor our Lord, you seek to worship Him, and to serve through the Order of the Eastern Star.

The Assembly sang "*This Is My Father's World*"

For those who have brought your Bibles with you this morning, please turn to I Corinthians 13. This book was written by the Apostle Paul and has been called the "Love Chapter" and it is probably one of the most famous passages of scripture; used often times at weddings and funerals and so on.

Paul says, "Though I speak with the tongues of men and of angels; but have not love, I have become sounding brass or a clanging cymbal."

"And though I have the gift of prophecy, and understand all mysteries and all knowledge, and though I have all faith, so that I could remove mountains, but have not love, I am nothing."

“And though I bestow all my goods to feed the poor, and though I give my body to be burned, but have not love, it profits me nothing.”

“Love suffers long and is kind; love does not envy; love does not parade itself, is not puffed up; does not behave rudely, does not seek its own, is not provoked, thinks no evil; does not rejoice in iniquity, but rejoices in the truth; bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things.”

“Love never fails. But whether there are prophecies, they will fail; whether there are tongues, they will cease; whether there is knowledge, it will vanish away.”

“For we know in part and we prophesy in part. But when that which is perfect has come, then that which is in part will be done away.”

“When I was a child, I spoke as a child, I understood as a child, I thought as a child; but when I became a man, I put away childish things.”

“For now we see in a mirror, dimly, but then face to face. Now I know in part, but then I shall know just as I also am known.”

“And now abide faith, hope, love, these three; but the greatest of these is love.”

“A Real Treasure”

Public speakers are always told to sit down and decide what you want to accomplish, what direction you want to go and what direction you want the group to whom you are speaking to travel as you speak. And in thinking about this, it became apparent to me that how we think often determines what we are, what we do; and, actually, what we accomplish in life. The dietitian says, “You are what you eat.” The physical therapist says, “You are what you do.” I had a son-in-law who passed away a number of years ago and he used to tell me this over and over again, “Dwain, if you don’t do more today than you have to do, it’s coming a time when you won’t be able to do what you have to do.” And, that certainly is true. Our bodies have the tendency to go downhill.

But, more important than the things we eat and the things we do, are the things we think. What we are, and often times what we accomplish and the goals we strive to fulfill are determined by the way we think. The thinking process is very important. What we put in our heads, often times determines what flows out of us as an individual.

We have a storage area at our house that is somewhat filled, along with a couple others. The squirrels were getting in. I went in one day and looked through the debris they brought in and it was all pine cones, no cardboard or pieces of wood. Just pinecones because in them were pine seeds that they were going to eat the coming winter. They put in what they were going to need and use in the future.

Certainly we can appreciate the fact that the things that we think about, the things that we learn and take in can determine our thinking and our processes. My mom used to store a lot of things up in the attic. Every once in a while I would go up and look through the stuff. She had my ninth grade science papers and my books, pictures and so on. I could sit there and look at what was accomplished in the past and realize that much of what was accomplished determined the type of person I became. It's an important thing that in that treasure chest of your mind there should be things that are pleasing, uplifting; bringing blessing to God and your fellow man. That's the important point, that's the battle of this life.

I brought these treasure chests this morning, a good treasure chest and a bad treasure chest. This is the bad treasure chest. I have a few things in here. I'd like to give the audience a couple of these necklaces. If you look at them, you'll find that the number 2012 is on them for this year. Prognosticators are telling us that this year the world is going to come to an end on December 21st or December 23rd. I'm going with the December 23rd crowd because my birthday is on the 22nd and I don't want to miss it.

The world's not going to end. It's going to be changed. It's my privilege to stand, often times, at a casket and tell the family there's coming a time when there will be no more sorrow or sadness or sickness; there'll be no more disappointments, for this old world shall become new.

In 2000 everybody was getting ready for "Y 2 K" and I said to Shirley, "Are you worried about Y 2 K?" She said, "Oh no, I'm not." I asked her, "Why is our pantry full now?" Unconsciously we do some of those things.

I have a few more things in this box I want to get rid of. A spider, a fly, another spider someone might enjoy playing with. In history, a chest like this is called "Pandora's Box". The old intellects of the ancient world said that one day this box was opened and out came all kinds of evil, and that's why we have evil in the world today, they say. These things came out and

infiltrated man's mind and they became evil. They no longer sought after God.

And, certainly, there's a truth in the fact that those things that came out of that box were certainly things that God did not approve of. I have a few of them listed here.

Greed: Anyone here not familiar with that word? There was a fellow in the Bible. He was the land owner where Lazarus was staying; he was called a "rich man." And, it says he "fared sumptuously." That means he ate some very delicious meals, filet mignon, chateaubriand, these things he fared on and he was dressed beautifully. He had a beautiful house; everything was perfect. But out at the end of his drive, was Lazarus who was a crippled man. He lay out at the gate of the rich man's house and begged as people came by. Both Lazarus and the rich man died. They went to the "place of eternal abode". The rich man was in a place of torment; Lazarus was in a place of blessing. The rich man looked up at Abraham and he asked for Lazarus to bring him a glass of water. Abraham told him that the two of them could not pass across between the two worlds. The rich man asked Abraham to send someone to tell his brothers what a terrible place he was in. Abraham replied, "They read the Old Testament every day. They have the prophets that tell them greed should not be present; that you should be caring for that individual." The rich man asked Abraham to send someone from where he was because the brothers were not paying attention to the Old Testament. Abraham replied that they wouldn't believe, "even if someone rose from the dead".

Another case in point was a rich young ruler. He heard the wonderful message that Jesus preached that He was going to offer people salvation and deliverance. The rich young ruler went to Jesus and said, "I would like to have this." Jesus told him to get rid of all of his possessions and come and follow Him. Well, that was a pretty big order. Jesus did not mean that there was something wrong with wealth. He's not saying that if you have money and your 401K hasn't dropped down to a 101K, it's alright. He's saying to the rich young man, "Who's first in your life? What is the primary thing you want to accomplish in your life? Those riches are blocking you, and until you realize that, you won't want to come follow Me."

Envy: I have a hard time deciding whether to hold up envy first or greed first. They're pretty closely related. An envious person could want the things that he doesn't have and could

be greedy about them; but greediness seems to imply that you already have them. Envy is that you would like to get them so you could be greedy.

There's only one of the Ten Commandments that deals with how we think. The Bible says you shouldn't kill; shouldn't commit adultery; steal; shouldn't tell lies about people. It's not until you get to the Tenth Commandment that it speaks anything about how you think. It says, "Thou shalt not covet your neighbors. And then He lists his wife, his man servants, his slaves, his possessions." You see, envy is that mental attitude that says I'd like to have what that person has. I'd like to have more than I presently have. Wishing to take it in some way, get it whether by legal or illegal means.

Hatred: Out of greed and envy grows hatred. The greedy man hates the person that might take it away from him. Or, those individuals that talk about his giving some of it to someone else. The envious man hates because he doesn't want to hear that he is envious; and he hates the individuals whom he is envying.

I have another treasure chest here today. The inside is better looking. I have a figurine of a young lady praying. She seems to be communicating with God. She has her hands up praying. It reminds me of the story about the four preachers that are arguing. One preacher says that you have to look up to heaven and look God right in the eye and tell Him what you want. The second preacher disagrees, saying you have to fold your hands and bow your head and not look up. The third one says you must lay flat on the carpet with your face down and hands out to pray to God. The fourth preacher said a couple of weeks ago he took a short cut through Farmer Jones' field and he fell in a well, head first. He said, "I'll guarantee you that the prayingest prayer I ever prayed was standing on my head in the bottom of that well."

Here is a child's glass shoe. This implied the eventual arrival of a new person on earth.

Here is a mother standing with her child.

I have three cards I'd like to go through with you.

Faith: What is faith? Many people have different definitions of it. The Bible has one in Hebrews 11, it says, "Faith is the actual material, the substance of things we can't see." You have faith in your husband or your wife. You have faith in our country. These things you can't actually see. This puts a reality to it. Faith is a transitive verb. I can't walk around this

room and say, "I have faith. I have faith." You have the subject who has faith and then the object upon whom faith is placed. Something you can't touch, you can't feel, you can't measure it, you can't put it in a bottle. It's a situation of your mind which says there is substance to that in which I place my trust. It's not something ethereal that flashes by when you hear a rather touching song or poem being read. Faith is something that puts meat on the bones of those things which are in our minds and our hearts.

Hope: We have a million definitions for hope. No doubt you've all heard about the fellow who went in every Saturday and prayed to God, "I need to win the lottery." After about five Saturdays, he heard a voice, "Give me a break; buy a ticket."

Hope is defined in the Bible as not hoping you win the lottery, not hoping you have a good day at the casino. That's a maybe yes and a maybe no situation. Hope has depth to it, gristle. A lady says that, "My husband died and my hope is that I will see him one day, face to face". She didn't say, "I hope I'll see him;" she said, "My hope is that I will see him one day" and that's the difference. It's not a flip-of-the-coin-type thing.

I want to talk about Abraham who lived in a big rich city called Ur of the Chaldees. He had great wealth, many animals, and a big household of people. God came and talked to him one day and asked Abraham to leave Ur and go to Canaan. I will give you that land; it will be fruitful and flow with milk and honey. Your family will grow and multiply, and you'll become a blessing to the whole world. Abraham didn't say, "Boy, I hope that really happens." Because of the reality of his hope, he packed up and he left for Canaan, having never looked upon the land that flows with milk and honey. The great promise God gave to Abraham was that "out of your loins will come a man who one day will purchase the world, give them the possibility of coming back in fellowship with Me." Abraham didn't say, "I hope I have that offspring." The reality of that hope was Jesus Christ who came many generations later.

Maybe the little glass shoe talks about hope. The mom looks at that and says, "My driving hope in my relationship with this young child that's just come into my family, is that it will be what it's supposed to be."

Love: We read the "Love Chapter" and I want to tell you that the King James Version uses the word "charity." Back in the England in 1620, charity was greater than love. You'd court a girl for two or three years, you'd go to her house and sit on

a bench next to her around the fire and mom and dad were on the other side of the room to make sure that things went well. After a couple three years, if the fellow said to the girl that he loved her, she probably would have run from the room crying. But, if he said he cherished her; that got her attention. The word love in the scripture is a translation of the Greek word agape which is the highest form of love. The next step down is filial love. Agape love transcends all human emotions. That's the type of love we should have toward God.

A point I want to conclude with is this. Jesus said if you love the people who love you, it's no big thing. He said if you do something for someone and you know 100% they're going to do it back to you, what kind of activity is that? That's not love or charity. Love is loving someone who doesn't love you or never had the chance to have a relationship with you. Doing something for someone can only become charity or love when you don't expect to get anything back from the person.

What an opportunity we have in Eastern Star. I've been an interim pastor in some churches. The major problem is that they're all getting grey hair. It's hard for a person who's 70 or 80 years old to make new friends. I talk to them and they say, "All my friends are dead. I don't have the energy to have them over to my house." I tell them, that's the key to growth; to befriend somebody and bring them into your fellowship. I know it's an effort. Spend money on those individuals. Take them out to dinner. Be a real friend to them. Do things for them never expecting to be repaid. I'll guarantee there'll come a time in their life when they'll say, "that person had something and I'm going to seek after it."

I hate to go to McDonald's and eat alone. I met this man who's younger than me and we talked every morning for six months. He's a mathematician and a scientist and I'd bring him notes and papers I thought he'd be interested in. One day out of the blue he said, "I'm going to church with you today." I almost fell over backward. That's what I wanted him to do, but I didn't want to ask him.

We need people in Eastern Star. Let's do something about getting them.

The Assembly sang "*On the Wings of a Dove*"

WGP: Thank you for those wonderful words, Brother Dwain. You have always led and conveyed the message of God by example; we appreciate your leadership.

Is it alright if I go over and talk to him?" His mom replied he could. The boy came back in about a half hour. His mom asked, "Did you talk to Grandpa?" He replied, "No, I just sat on his lap and helped him cry."

He embarked upon an active membership holding the office of Worthy Patron seven times He also served as Worthy Grand Patron (one of the youngest) from 1967-1968 with Worthy Grand Matron Helen Thomas. Brother Walt was an active member of the community giving support to the Idaho Youth Ranch. He served in the Idaho State National Guard in 1943 and was a successful businessman serving as the optician of Walt's Optical Shop where he retired in 1980.

A sheaf was presented in Ruth Chapter in memory of Brother Walt on March 1, 2012, by the Past Grands' Association. Its minute parts represented the small acts of kindness and duty to our order which he portrayed in his life. One of his favorite songs "One Day at a Time" was played as the old sheaf was retired and the new one placed on the pedestal.

Brother Walt went to join his beloved wife Lucille on November 16, 2011. He is greatly missed by his family, his Eastern Star family, and his numerous friends. This poem reflects Walt's willingness to accept God's will.

**MEMORIAL TRIBUTE FOR HAROLD HOLM, PGP
Janet Jensen-Fullmer, PGM and Shirley Butler, PGM:**

He was faithful and kind in all his ways,
Upright and just to the end of this days,
Sincere and true in heart and mind,
What a beautiful memory he leaves behind.

Another link in the golden chain of our Past Grands has been severed. The record of human life is often written in a few words, but the influence of a life can be told by those who came in contact with Harold, his actions, purpose and dedication in life will always be remembered forever, not only in the Eastern Star circle, but also the many other circles in his life.

Brother Harold was born May 20, 1923 in Idaho Falls, Idaho to Swedish parents, Ivar and Ida Holm. He lived and worked on the family farm in Coltman, just north of Idaho Falls. He graduated from Ucon High School and was awarded a Music Scholarship to Idaho State University, but declined it to stay home and help on the family farm. He married LaVerne Nelson in 1941, and began working on the Nelson family farm as well. Harold and LaVerne had three sons and a daughter.

In 1944 he enlisted in the United States Army in the Infantry Division, serving two tours of duty in the Philippines. He had reached the rank of 1st Lieutenant when he was discharged in 1951. Brother Harold attended Utah State University, graduating in 1952 with a Bachelor of Science degree. He and his family returned to Idaho Falls where he was an operations and planning manager at the Idaho National Engineering Laboratory for thirty-five years. Harold and LaVerne later divorced.

Brother Harold started his Masonic career by becoming a member of Eagle Rock Lodge 19 in 1947. His leadership qualities were immediately recognized and he served two terms as Worshipful Master. He served the Grand Lodge of Idaho AF&AM as District Deputy Grand Master and Right

Worshipful Grand Lecturer. He was also a member of York Rite Masons, Scottish Rite Masons and El Korah Shrine Temple.

Brother Harold joined Henrietta Chapter 21, Order of the Eastern Star in 1953 and held various offices, including Worthy Patron four times. I had the pleasure, along with Sister Darlene Schiers, to work with Brother Harold for five years in revising the Idaho Code and Digest. His knowledge of procedures of our Order was invaluable.

Harold served the General Grand Chapter of the Eastern Star when he was appointed to fill the unexpired term of his friend Robert O. Flood on the ESTARL Committee in 1987. He was chosen to serve as Ambassador to Japan 1997-2000.

Harold married one of his lifelong friends, Doris Flood in 1989 which added her son and daughter to his family.

Brother Harold served the Grand Chapter as Worthy Grand Patron in 1971-1972 with Sister Laura Callender at their 'Symphony of Service' Session and I was honored to be their Grand Adah. He became a Dual Member of Liberty Chapter 51 in 1992. His untiring dedication and willingness to serve was our Chapter gain as he held various offices including Worthy Patron many times, and I shared the East with him as Worthy Matron. He was admired for his command of presentation and perfection in the Ritualistic work and would often say of this Worthy Matron, (if I missed a word or made a mistake) "she is new at this".

Harold was an active member in many civic and fraternal organizations. He had many special talents and hobbies, but most of all, Harold loved to sing. He will be remembered by his family and friends for his beautiful and calming bass-baritone voice. His voice rang out at church services, weddings, funerals or any other special occasion. He served as a soloist for the Idaho Opera Guild in the 'Messiah' and the 'Mikado'. But we remember his rendition of the 'Lords' Prayer', 'How Great Thou Art' or 'Bless This House' at many of our Chapter meetings, at Idaho Grand Chapter, as well as Chapters from other Grand Jurisdictions.

MWGM was escorted to the Grand East.

WGP: MWGM Jay and Illustrious Sir, thank you for taking time out of your very busy schedule to be with us this evening.

Jay Leonard: It's a real honor for me to be here. WGM Sandi, thank you so much for the invitation some while back. I put it on the calendar and I made it a promise. I want to thank both of you for your service to the Eastern Star and the Masonic Family here in Idaho. I think you've had a great year and I appreciate everything you've done.

This year I've had a little medal made. It's the Idaho Free Masons Medal of Merit. I have one for each of you to thank you, personally, from me to you, for all that you've done.

I promised myself whenever I find myself in a position like this, to take a moment to look around to see what I can see and enjoy what I see. This is a real treat because usually it's just a room with men in black suits, there's no color. The beautiful dresses, the great smiles, the beautiful ladies, this is very special.

My schedule has changed and it won't allow me to go to the Jobies' Grand Session. Alex and Kailee are here and I want them to come to the East just a second. These beautiful young ladies have served the Job's Daughters of Idaho so wonderfully. I see them everywhere. They always give me a hug and a big smile. If we were going to be able to attend Grand Session in Burley, I would present a Medal of Merit to each of them there. I'd like to give them their medals tonight.

Yesterday we were in Vancouver, Washington at the Grand Lodge of Washington along with Most Worshipful Brother Jeff. A week ago we were in New York with the Brethren of the Fiat Lux Lodge and Most Worshipful Brother James Sullivan. A month ago we had just gotten back from Washington, D.C. and a tour, on which some of the brothers and sisters went. That has just filled me up to overflowing with such pride for our Masonic family at the things that are done and our history.

For some reason, right now, I'm stuck on our history. In Washington, D.C. we went to the George Washington National

Masonic Memorial and saw an awful lot of things there that were tied to George Washington and his time as a Mason and as a soldier and as a President. It was incredible. We went to Mount Vernon and saw his tomb and we climbed the back stairway to his bedroom. We used the same stair rail he had. I thought that was pretty awesome.

The problem is that at Mount Vernon and at the Capital Visitors Center, there's no mention of him, to speak of, as a Mason. The only place we found mention of him as a Mason was at the Masonic Memorial. I am so thankful for that memorial and for that reminder.

We went to the Smithsonian and the various memorials to the wars. We were astounded at the numbers of men and women who have fought and died for our country. It was all amazing.

And then we went to New York. Not all of you probably know why the Grand Master of Idaho goes to New York. In 1938 the Grand Lodge of Idaho, under the direction of the Grand Master at the time, wrote a white paper that condemned the Nazi regime for the atrocities they were perpetrating in Europe against groups and individuals at that time.

Fiat Lux Lodge, at that time, was a Jewish Lodge in New York and they noticed this and invited the Grand Master to come and they thanked him for that and they've invited the Grand Master of Idaho back every year since then. So we were honored to go. What was amazing was that it was as real to them today as if it were 1938. They give the Masonic family of Idaho an awful lot of credit. They look at us as the first organization of any type that stood up and did the right thing with regard to Hitler and what he was doing. The very, very first one and because of what we did as Idaho Masons and ladies and the Masonic Family, a tidal wave was begun that resulted in the removal of this tyrant. It was an amazing experience for Jean and me.

I didn't know this, but the Grand Lodge of New York purchased Tappan House, a historic building. It's outside of the city 45 minutes. It was headquarters used by George Washington. On the side of the building the original builder put the date of the building in brick imbedded in the wall, 1700. George Washington headquartered there three or four different times. What's most meaningful to me at this particular point in time was after Benedict Arnold had been found out, he was being held at a pub just down the street from Tappan House.

That pub still operates today and we actually had brunch there. But he and Major Andre of the British conspired to give the secrets of West Point from the Americans to the British. West Point was seen as a critical point of defense. They felt that had we lost West Point, we'd lose the war. It was in Tappan House that George Washington wrote the death warrant for those two traitors and it was in Tappan House, the next morning, he asked the shutters be closed because he did not want to witness the hanging of the traitors.

Well, lots of stories, but what does it have to do with us today? I guess my point is, as Masons in the Masonic family, we have a rich history. We can be very proud of our brothers and sisters who have preceded us. They have made the difference in so many ways. Just like you're making a difference today because you change people's lives. Your lives were changed as you came into this Masonic Family. Your families were affected, your work, your community. All of them benefit because of that.

Freedom of speech, freedom of religion and free public schools, because the Masons insisted on it when they wrote the Declaration of Independence, the Constitution and the Bill of Rights.

The problem is you don't read about that in the history books. Historians have removed the Masons. If you and I don't keep track of this and keep the pride and remember the heritage, who will? We need to be proud of our past. We need to record that past. How important our secretaries are. How important it is that you jot down the things you do; the thousands of dollars that the members of the Idaho Masonic Family give every year to scholarships, to Books for Bikes, to our charities. Those things need to be recorded. Just like the number of children we help with the CHIPS programs, or the number of pints of blood that our family gives in Masonic settings at times. All of these things are ways we change our world, our society. The good that we do needs to be recorded. I encourage you to keep a history of your chapters and lodges so that it isn't hard to find these wonderful things you're doing. These things we can be so proud of.

And, then, finally remember a predecessor that stood up for what was right against the Nazis or against the unfair taxation when it wasn't popular, when it risked or cost them their lives. And we need to, as they did, be ready to stand up for what is right. I know you'll do that. Thanks so much. It was a real honor to be here.

We appreciated the generosity of the Past Matrons and Past Patrons of Ruth Chapter who sent money in the amount \$64.00 for a Christmas gift for the recipients. I split it between the five members on monthly assistance.

A very special thanks goes to Grand Secretary Denise and Grand Treasurer John for their dedication to get our requests for funds to our members on a very timely basis. Grand Treasurer John, I want to compliment you on your first year and your help and assistance while you were in your learning period.

GRAND CHAPLAIN REPORT

Valerie Aiken Sievers: Our Grand Session theme of “Treasured Memories” is a perfect description for the job of Grand Chaplain. The memories of our departed Sisters and Brothers, for all their loved ones, family and friends, truly do become their most treasured legacy. I felt privileged that memories were shared that allowed me to know and appreciate the wonderful and varied lives of our departed members. I join their families in sadness for the loss, yet may we all find peace in celebrating their life and the treasured legacy they left behind.

Since becoming Grand Chaplain one year ago, I have been notified of the loss of 109 members from our jurisdiction. Of these losses, there were 32 Past Matrons; 15 Past Patrons; 46 had Voluntary Prepaid Life Memberships in their respective chapters and 52 were our precious Golden Stars.

Sadly, Henrietta Chapter 21 suffered the greatest loss with the passing of eleven members. Meridian Chapter 66 lost ten members and Shoshone Chapter 10 and Twin Falls Chapter 29 each lost seven.

I found every member we lost unique, beloved and special. With your indulgence, I'd like to name a few whose rich lives deserve mention.

Sister Hazel Dennis, one of our centenarians at 102 years old and mother-in-law of Doniece Dennis, Worthy Matron of Queen Esther 12, was a member for 82 years in our wonderful Order!

Sister Zoie McLean of Crescent 43 was our oldest member who lived to be 106 years young.

Other centenarians were Sisters Annabelle Erwin, 104, Star of the West 35; Cleo Aarlie, 101, Queen Esther 12; and Nancy Sage, 105, Meridian 66, Sister Nancy was also one of the last remaining survivors of the terrible 1906 San Francisco earthquake and fire. We were very blessed to have had these dedicated sisters amongst us.

Our beloved deceased members represent a combined

total of 5,094.35 years of membership and dedicated service to Eastern Star.

It is exceptionally noteworthy that of the 109 deceased members, twenty five of them served their Country through one of the many branches of our military.

Chapters that reported no deaths this past year were Mountain Queen 11, Lorraine 20, Cosmopolitan 36, and Liberty 51.

Our hearts go out to the several Grand Officers who lost beloved family members. The Worthy Grand Patron's mother, Associate Grand Matron's mother, Associate Grand Patron's father-in-law, Grand Organist's father, Grand Adah's husband, and personally, my father prior to Grand Chapter last year and my son-in-law.

Our Grand Jurisdiction also lost two Past Grand Patrons, Brother Walter Culbertson, who served as Worthy Grand Patron in 1967-1968 with Helen Thomas (deceased) as his Worthy Grand Matron at their "Constant Cross" session and Brother Harold Holm, who served as Worthy Grand Patron in 1971-1972 and presided with Laura Callender (deceased) at their "Symphony of Service" session.

There was also the loss of 44 Past Grand Matrons and 54 Past Grand Patrons from other Grand Jurisdictions in the U.S., Canada and Bolivia. Of those 44 Past Grand Matrons, two were Past Most Worthy Grand Matrons, Sister Florence Adair and Sister Lois Newman. There were no losses of elected or appointed Grand Officers in any of the other Grand Jurisdictions this past year.

I would like to thank all of the Chapter Secretaries for notifying me about their deceased members. I could not do this job without them and I appreciate the work they do, very much. A special thank you to our Grand Secretary, Denise, for helping me often with missing information.

To my Worthy Grand Matron Sandi and Worthy Grand Patron, Bob, I sincerely thank you both for the honor you have given to me and to Boise Chapter 65 with this appointment. It has been my privilege to serve as your Grand Chaplain.

It has truly been a year of much reflection, a few challenges, yet countless rewards and "Treasured Memories". While it may not be the easiest of jobs to do, providing some small comfort to grieving hearts does make it a very worthwhile and gratifying one. I thank you for this opportunity.

JURISPRUDENCE REPORT – PARTIAL

Bucky Finley PGP, Chairman: I want to thank the Committee for all their help and dedication this year, they have been a dedicated knowledgeable committee to work with.

Questions and Answers submitted to Jurisprudence:

A Grand Representative that belonged to a chapter that dissolved, did not affiliate with another chapter, and was, therefore, not a member of the Eastern Star. Jurisprudence recommended the member be asked to return the Grand Representative pin to the Worthy Grand Matron and the Worthy Grand Matron recommend another appointment to fulfill the remainder of the term. The pin was returned and another member was appointed to fill the remaining portion of the term.

Grand Officer Appointments: The Associate Grand Matron and Associate Grand Patron presented their recommendations of members for appointed Grand Officers for approval. Jurisprudence approved the list as presented. One of these is now on a Standing Committee and will need to resign from that committee prior to being installed as a Grand Officer.

Clarification for Secretaries: seconds to motions: The Worthy Grand Matrons have been asking the Chapter Secretaries to record the names of members seconding a motion. Sister Sandi had asked Jurisprudence for a ruling, as there were differences of opinion on the issue. Jurisprudence recommends that the name of the seconder not be recorded. There is nothing in the General Grand Chapter Red Book, requiring recording the name of the person making a second to a motion.

There is nothing in the Idaho Code and Digest requiring the name of a person making a second.

Both of these books of rules require that we follow Robert's Rules of Order.

Roberts Rules of Order, The Modern Edition, Article X, Officers and Boards, Sec. 51, Secretary and Minutes, states the following: The minutes should not contain the names of seconds of motions, the Secretary's opinions on matters, any withdrawn motions, the proceedings in a committee of the whole, or a summary of the remarks of a guest speaker.

VPLM Question: The member held a dual membership. The member demitted from her primary Chapter A. The member did not pay the required additional fee to carry the VPLM to Chapter B that she now belonged to. She then

rejoined Chapter A, which is now the secondary chapter. Jurisprudence ruled that Chapter B is now her primary chapter, and the additional fee must be paid in order for the VPLM to follow when the dues are higher in the chapter becoming the primary.

Grand Representatives: The Worthy Grand Matron submitted recommendations for Past Matrons and Past Patrons to serve as Grand Representatives. Jurisprudence approved the eligibility of the proposed appointments.

Election of Officers: A chapter asked the Worthy Grand Matron for a dispensation for election of officers out of time. Idaho Code and Digest, Article III, Elections, Section 2 states the election shall be held the first stated meeting in April. A dispensation was granted to Elect Out of Time. This was done in reference to Rules and Regulations, Article VII, Section B, 2c. However, it was in violation of General Grand Chapter's Book of Instructions, under Elections, page 54, which states, "A dispensation cannot be issued to elect officers in advance of the time fixed by the Rules and Regulations governing Subordinate Chapters".

2012 – 2013 Committees: Jurisprudence received from the Associate Grand Matron recommendations of members to serve on the committees for the year 2012 - 2013. Jurisprudence has approved the eligibility of proposed appointments as submitted, and also the recent changes that were requested.

Worthy Grand Matron's Annual Report: We approved the Worthy Grand Matron's Annual Report and the Worthy Grand Patron's Annual Report.

Associate Grand Matron's Appointments: The Jurisprudence Committee approved the appointments for the Standing Committees for the year 2012 – 2013.

The following amendment to the Constitution of the Grand Chapter of Idaho was submitted at the 2011 Grand Chapter Session. The amendment was read by the WGP.

AMENDMENT TO CONSTITUTION

ARTICLE VIII, ELECTIONS AND APPOINTMENTS, Section 2C, Page 8

Now reads: The Grand Secretary and Grand Treasurer shall not hold office for more than ten (10) years.

Change to read: The Grand Secretary and Grand Treasurer shall not hold office for more than seven (7) years.

Rational: A 10 year commitment to these two Grand Offices is too long. A 7 year term is a more reasonable commitment. A survey of other jurisdictions indicates that 7 years is more the norm. A 7 year term allows the officer to become proficient in the duties of the office without becoming 'burned out.'

Help us keep our thoughts free from discord and to remember our obligation as members of the Order of the Eastern Star. We are committed to charity, truth, love, faith and hope and ask Your guidance in these endeavors. In Thy name we pray. Amen

The Assembly joined the Grand Choir in singing "You Are My Sunshine" as the opening ode.

*The **Grand Marshal** proclaimed the session from refreshment to labor.*

WGM: Thank you Sister Lois for the beautiful prelude and the music you have provided for this session.

We will now have a short break from our business in order to set up the audio/visual equipment needed for a presentation by a representative of the Portland Shriners Hospital for Children, our Special Project.

WGP: Several years ago, when we were getting ready for this year, Sister Sandi and I got together and discussed what to do for our special project during our year. She graciously accepted my suggestion that we donate to some aspect of the Shrine Hospital in Portland.

I went to the Directors of the hospital and asked them for the project that most needed funding or one they could foresee would need funding in the next several years. Their response was providing the orthodontic care to children undergoing surgical procedures at the hospital to correct their cleft lip and palate conditions.

They set up a fund over a year ago and they have been putting money into that fund through a variety of sources in order to build it up to provide orthodontic care through the hospital to local orthodontists in the communities where the children reside.

At Homecoming we gave a check for \$1,700 to the fund. There was already \$1,300 in the fund and today, through your generosity, we are going to give another check for \$5,000. That does not include the proceeds from the basket silent auction, the sale of pins during our "Treasured Memories" session. We're hoping there'll be several thousand more dollars going into the Grand Chapter account to be paid to the hospital.

It is my pleasure to introduce Kerry O'Leary, RN, MBA, the Outpatient and Care Coordination Manager at the Shriners Hospital for Children in Portland, Oregon.

She started her career working at the Shrine Hospital. She has seen subsequent stints at the Los Angeles Hospital and has worked at the burn unit at the Boston Hospital. Kerry has also been in private practice.

She supervises the Care Coordinator who supervises the team handling the cleft lip and palate treatment at the Portland Hospital. Andy, who spoke to us at Homecoming, was a speech therapist who is one of the individuals who works for Kerry.

We're very grateful to the hospital for letting Kerry come to Idaho to be with us today.

Dr. O'Leary explained what a cleft lip and palate is, how it occurs and its short term and long term effects. She explained what is done to close the lip and palate and any other deformities associated with the malformation. She then explained the long term surgical needs of the patients as they grow and develop. Patients are in the program until age 21.

Dr. O'Leary explained the current state of the program in which there are currently 200 active patients in varying stages of correction and 75 to 100 patients on a waiting list. Between 25 and 30 of the patients referred to above are from Idaho. Two of the Idaho patients have no insurance and will benefit from our program.

Dr. O'Leary showed several before and after pictures and then answered questions.

The WGP continued with the business of the Grand Chapter.

The Tellers Committee was dismissed.

ARTICLE X, GRAND CHAPTER COMMITTEES, Section 2, Paragraph J, Page 27

This Resolution changes the closing time for registration from 5:00 p.m. Monday to 2:00 p.m. Monday.

FRATERNAL CORRESPONDENCE

Jan Brown, AGC: With the help of Sue Warner, GC and Karen Juell, AGM, the three of us have traversed state proceedings from Alabama to Wyoming, and have read about grand sessions held in these various jurisdictions, as well as many in Australia and Canada. The grand chapters range from having nine chapters to 219 chapters. Australia celebrated its 13th annual session in June 2011, while Pennsylvania celebrated its 187th annual session the same month, making it the oldest grand chapter. PA has 31,250 members, but only 1,750 are males. Ohio had 14 General Grand Chapter Officers attend their session in 2011. We also found that many chapters have closed, but some who had been under dispensation received their charters back.

WGM's and WGP's special projects have included Cancer Centers for Children, OES/Masonic Homes, Alzheimer's Research, sponsorship of all-star high school football games, Masonic Youth, Shriner's Hospitals, Autism, Heart Association, Locks of Love, Service Dogs, Diabetes, Parkinson's Disease, Candy Striper Life Flight Program where they help buy equipment for the air ambulances within the state, and Salvation Army - just to name a few. Some states, such as North Dakota, require their star points to each have a special project. For instance, in 2010, their Grand Adah had Language Centers, Grand Ruth had ESTARL, Grand Esther had Masonic Cancer Center, Grand Martha had Peace

Gardens, and Grand Electa had Rainbow and DeMolay. To raise money for these various charities, the chapters do the usual fundraising activities, but some have also recycled toner cartridges and cell phones, held chili cook offs, fall harvest fests, and walk-a-thons.

Some of the more interesting things noted during our review of the many proceedings, included the following:

One state requires resumes be prepared for those seeking elective offices.

One grand chapter has a payroll, where they pay their Grand Officers, representatives and various members \$55 each to attend grand chapter. In 2010, their payroll expense was \$14,100.

In one jurisdiction, the tornado sirens went off while the secretary was reading the minutes during an official visit. So, the WM declared a recess, all members wishing to stay reconvened in a makeshift chapter room in the basement, quickly completed their business, and closed, sending everyone home.

Another WGM had to stop for a flock of chickens crossing the road during one of her official visits.

And at another visit, the Associate Grand Conductress got locked inside a room while changing clothes, and after banging on the door for several minutes, was rescued by someone with a key to let her out!

Pennsylvania raised \$93,400 for a children's home at the Masonic Village in Elizabethtown, \$88,150 to the Multiple Sclerosis foundation of PA, and \$125,700 for Service Dogs for PA Veterans. That's over \$300,000 for just three charities, and they had other charities that didn't receive as much as these three.

One grand chapter offers communion during their Sunday worship service.

And, one jurisdiction owns cemetery lots throughout the state, many close to Eastern Star homes, and provides these lots to members and family members on a donation basis.

As noted in the various proceedings, Idaho was well represented at many, especially the western states. Thank you to the members who have traveled to these special events and corresponded with counterparts. There is an exciting world out there in the various grand chapters - so share in the excitement. Visit another jurisdiction and see what special

adventure is in store for you!

Thank you for giving us this opportunity to explore the world of other Eastern Star jurisdictions.

ESTARL FUND

Jeanne Jennings PM (20): Being able to help students who desire to enter the field of religious service is a rewarding endeavor. We are truly funding our future, and supporting the belief in a Supreme Being who rules the universe for good. The ESTARL Fund is such a worthwhile project, and I am proud that The Order of The Eastern Star raises money to assist these students and to enable them to meet their calling.

JURISPRUDENCE COMMITTEE FINAL REPORT

Bucky Finley, PGP, Chairman: We need to make one correction in the Partial Report of the Jurisprudence Committee presented yesterday approving the Worthy Grand Matron's Final Report. Jurisprudence finds that the amendment approved to the By-Laws of Meridian Chapter 66 having two months during the year that do not have a specific day specified for their stated meetings, does not comply with Code. Idaho Code and Digest, Rules and Regulations, Article II, Chapter Meetings, Section 1A, states, "The day, hour and place shall be specified in the by-laws and no business shall be transacted before the time stated."

The By-Laws of Meridian Chapter 66 need to be amended

to be in compliance with Code, and have all the days of Stated Meetings specified.

Jurisprudence approves the changes and additions to the Associate Grand Matron's last Committee appointments. The General Arrangements Committee listed in the Associate Grand Matron's list of appointments should be listed with the Session Committees not the Standing Committees, Article X, Grand Chapter Committees, Section 3C.

Jurisprudence approves the Worthy Grand Matron's Supplemental Report.

Legislation Number C-1: Constitution, Article VIII, Election and Appointments, Section 2C, changes the Grand Secretary's and Grand Treasurer's maximum term from 10 to 7 years. Resolution Failed.

Legislation Number 1: By-Laws and Rules, Article IX, Grand Representatives, Section 1. This resolution was to change the requirements from Past Matron or Past Patron to members with 5 years membership and having shown distinguished and active service. This Resolution was found not in proper form.

Legislation Number 2: By-Laws and Rules, Article X Grand Chapter Committees, Section 2, Paragraph J. This Resolution changes the closing time for registration from 5:00 p.m. to 2:00 p.m. Monday. Resolution Adopted.

Legislation Number 3: Rules and Regulations, Article VI, Powers and Duties of Officers, Section 6, S3. This Resolution would delete paragraph 3 except the last sentence, and would have relieved the Grand Secretary from the requirement of ascertaining whether another Grand Jurisdiction allowed dual membership. This Resolution was withdrawn by the author.

The business of the Grand Chapter was completed and the WGP returned the gavel to the WGM. All Session Committees and appointments whose duties were completed at this Grand Chapter were discharged as well as all members whose terms of office expire at the close of this Grand Chapter.

WGM: I want to thank each of you who have served in any capacity during this year. Every committee has an important

purpose at the Grand Chapter Session. We thank you for your willingness to serve and for the excellent manner with which you performed your duties. The readiness of our members to serve is what makes our Grand Chapter function. Sisters and Brothers help me thank our committee members.

Vicki Chamberlain (33), President of Grand Representatives Association, announced that the Association has given a gift of \$300 to the WGM's and WGP's Project.

ADDRESS OF THE WORTHY GRAND MATRON

Karen Juell: I want to start off by stating a simple truth. I am here today because I was a Job's Daughter.

My mother got me involved in Job's Daughters here in Idaho Falls. My mother wanted to make sure that I had interests and activities of my own in a community that was dominated by one religion to which we did not belong. Job's Daughters fit the bill. It became my life. My Jobie sisters were my best friends. My guardians and council members were my mentors. I learned lots of things in Jobies, like how to tie a square knot, how to walk with three feet of cape trailing behind me, how to pull off a kidnap breakfast and the best method of freezing undergarments at a slumber party. But more importantly, I learned many life lessons: lessons about patience, perseverance, hopefulness, faith and love that have carried me through life, right up to this very year. When I have wondered why bad things happen to good people, I look no

further than the Book of Job. If Job could endure, so can I.

I am honored beyond words to be your Worthy Grand Matron. I aim to be “worthy” — worthy of the love you have shown me throughout my Eastern Star life and worthy of the trust you have placed in me. I must admit that I never aspired to be a “matron,” no matter how grand. I looked up the definition of matron in the dictionary, and here is the kindest one I could find: “a married woman, especially one who is mature and staid or dignified and has an established social position.” It was right above “a female prison warden.”

I did not get to this position by myself. I have been supported by my family, especially by my husband, Paul Menser, who is not “Masonically inclined,” but is content to let me do my thing, and my son, Bill, who has had to share me with Eastern Star since he was a baby. I hope he knows he has always come first. My mother, Evelyn, passed away last August. She wasn’t a member of Eastern Star. She wasn’t much of a joiner period, but if I needed anything — food, decorations, monetary support, babysitting — she was there. I have missed her this year as I’ve been getting ready for today. In her own Evelyn Juell way, I know she would have been proud.

I also want to acknowledge my friends Harold and Doris Holm. I would not be in this position if they hadn’t invited me to travel to Friendship Nights and Installations at other chapters with them when I was a “new Star.” I used to tell people that I spent a lot of time in the back seat of Harold’s car, and it was true, for that’s where I sat with Mary Schaeffer, Barbara Ozmun and Lisa Uebelhack on trips to Blackfoot, Ashton, and Pocatello. As many of you can attest, once you start getting out on the OES trail, it’s hard to stop. I was hoping that their increasingly frail health in recent years would hold out long enough for Harold and Doris to see me installed as Worthy Grand Matron. I know they wished for the same thing. It was not to be, but I feel their presence here today.

Would the members of Henrietta Chapter please stand? What can I say to you, but thank you? I’m so happy to see you all here today and owe you so much. I know my little adventure has become your journey, too. I hope I make you proud. Thank you for standing by me. Some of you were my Jobie guardians and worked with me when I was a guardian. Would you stay standing? I also want to acknowledge the members of Idaho Falls Chapter 85, Liberty Chapter 51 and Esther Chapter

14 for their encouragement and support. Would you please stand?

Installing Officers Lucy, Dick, Shirley, Hazel, Pete, and Christy, and Narrator Jim, you have all inspired me in some way in my Eastern Star life and are dear, dear friends. It makes me smile to see you all here. You all did a wonderful job, but I have to say that it wouldn't be an installation for me if Shirley Butler weren't in the East giving me my charge.

Our theme this year is "Making a Difference." One of my favorite quotes is attributed to Anne Frank, "How wonderful it is that no one need wait a single moment to improve the world." So, don't wait, Sisters and Brothers. We can make a difference in our chapters, in our neighborhoods and in the world and we challenge you to do so.

The rest of the information about our term is printed in your program, but I want to highlight a few things. My flower is the lily of the valley, which is connected to both Eastern Star and Job's Daughters.

Our projects are the Grand Chapter Educational Endowment Fund and the Mountain States Tumor Institute. The interest earned from the Educational Endowment Fund provides money for the scholarships we award each year. Not only do I value the education I received, but I am an educator, so this seemed appropriate. I also felt we needed to do something toward cancer. Gary and Robbie's daughter and I both had Hodgkin's disease, cancer of the lymph system, and I have been undergoing cancer treatments again this year. All of us know someone who has been affected by cancer and many of us have been treated for the disease ourselves. The Mountain States Tumor Institute does research and has clinics in many communities in Eastern and Southern Idaho. I hope our donation will be used for patient care services.

I also feel I must become an advocate for Ovarian Cancer Awareness. This particular form of cancer is particularly deadly because the symptoms are so vague that by the time it's diagnosed, it's usually too late for treatment to make much of a difference. I am fortunate that my cancer presented itself differently and my prognosis is good. Nevertheless, I hope to raise awareness of the symptoms of the disease among our members so no one receives grimmer news.

I chose the Bible on the Altar from a collection Henrietta Chapter has accumulated throughout its history. It was given to the chapter by PGP Jay and Elsie Redfield 75 years ago when

Jay was Worthy Grand Patron in honor of his Grand Ruth, Vera Busby. Sister Shirley Butler presented the Bible marker to me earlier this year. Sister Mabel Rosa made it for Gem Chapter 50, which merged with Henrietta. It links Gary's and my chapters as Sister Mabel was a member of Golden Rod Chapter. When Shirley noticed that the marker did not have the Grand Chapter pentagon around the star, she beaded the pentagon herself. This makes it a Mabel Rosa/Shirley Butler Bible marker, and very special indeed.

In addition to the Bible, I will be carrying other bits of Henrietta's Grand Chapter history with me as I travel this year. Fifty years ago, Jane Benfer of Henrietta Chapter was installed as Worthy Grand Matron. While we claim Past Grand Matrons Shirley Butler and Josephine Spraker as members, I am the first member elected out of Henrietta to be Worthy Grand Matron since Sister Jane. I will be carrying one of her bells. We also have two Past Grand Patrons besides Brother Jay, Brother Harold Holm and Brother Robert Flood. I hope to have something of theirs to take with me, too.

Finally, Sisters and Brothers, I want to thank you for making me a part of the history of this Grand Chapter. You mean the world to me. Your kindness and thoughtfulness inspire me daily. So many of you have helped me get ready for today in ways both great and small that if I named one, I'd forget a dozen; so I won't even try. Just know how grateful I am to be your 2012-2013 Worthy Grand Matron.

I think my husband has a present for me now. **Paul Menser** sang "*You've Got a Friend*" accompanying himself on guitar.

WGM: I'd like to introduce Sister Anna Knecht, who is the Associate Grand Matron of Oregon and Sister Valerie Williams who is the Associate Grand Matron of Wyoming. We've become friends over the last three years while we've traveled this trail together. I just wanted to acknowledge you. Thank you very much for coming.

ADDRESS OF WORTHY GRAND PATRON

Doc Lemarr: I am still in awe and appreciate your confidence in me to represent you. I would like to thank our Installing Officers, but especially Dick. It was about a month ago that I had the pleasure of installing him in his own chapter as Associate Patron.

I could not stand to speak before a group like this before Eastern Star. As you can tell, I still get nervous and I probably always will. I love Star and our relationship to the Masonic fraternity. We share in the same principles of love, relief and truth.

I would like to thank Brother Bob for a job well-done this past year.

This year I will work to promote the welfare and prosperity of our order. Just before I left for this Grand Session, I received a note from Past Grand Matron Glenadene Keister. She apologized to me for missing her first Grand Chapter in 53 years. She wanted to be here to see two of her favorite people installed, Sister Karen Cameron and me. She said to "remember you are here at this time and in this place for a reason."

I want to acknowledge Karen's counterpart, Sister Anna from Oregon. She was a classmate of mine in dental school. She is a member of Orenomah Chapter in Oregon and my grandparents were Past Matron and Past Patron of Orenomah. It will be an honor and pleasure to serve this Grand Chapter. I will do my very best to provide a general supervision over the affairs. That's in my job description to supervise the affairs of the order. Just let me know and I'll be sure to supervise those. The unofficial theme for our session is "Short and Sweet" and you can figure out who is whom. Our official theme is, "Making a Difference." Each of you makes a difference in this Grand Chapter, your own chapters, your families and your communities. Remember your obligation and the lesson of Electa, "Love One Another."

It has been 79 years since Golden Rod has had a Worthy Grand Patron. Past Grand Patron Leon Rosa, though attending Hermosa 32, was a Charter Member of Golden Rod. At the time he served as Worthy Grand Patron in 1933-1934, he was still a member of Golden Rod Chapter. He demitted in 1941. At that time dual membership was not allowed and when it became legal, he affiliated and was a member of both chapters when he passed.

You will note that there are only six months until the end of the Mayan calendar, 12/21/12. If there is any truth to the supposition, our term will be the shortest ever. I would like to apologize now for the Official Visits that will not be made after the 21st. If we do get to June next year, our session will be the 111th Grand Session.

I would like to leave you with a quote by Will Rogers, “Long ago when men cursed and beat the ground, it was called witchcraft. Today it’s called golf.”

Paul Menser: That first song was by Carol King. This second one for Gary is a song by John Lennon. Paul sang “*Imagine*” accompanying himself on guitar.

Back here is Max Hemmert, Worshipful Master of Caribou Lodge 84 and District Deputy Grand Master for Grand Lodge; my good friend Frank, and Cheri Hernandez, Nancy Diaz, Sue Smith, Jim Hunzeker, Robbie Lemarr, Janet Wheeler and, of course, my Grand Officer Joan Davis, and my daughter, Celeste.

WGM: This is my sister, Nancy, also a former Jobie.

Idaho 49, St. Maries – To move the Charter to Moscow Masonic Temple for a meeting in September.

Clover 33, Rathdrum – To move the charter to Sandpoint for a joint Official Visit.

Crescent 43, Kamiah – To move the charter to Grangeville for a joint Official Visit.

Mountain Queen 11, Grangeville – To elect and install a Secretary out of time.

Golden Rob 64, Soda Springs – To install the Associate Conductress out of time.

Star of the West 35, Wendell – To move the Charter to Gooding Masonic Temple for the Official Visit.

Potlatch 48, Potlatch – To elect and install a WP and AP out of time.

Esther 14, Blackfoot – To elect and install an Associate Conductress out of time.

Hugh Duncan 2, Salmon – To move the Charter to Challis Masonic Temple for the joint Official Visit.

Henrietta 21, Idaho Falls – To elect officers out of time.

Henrietta 21, Idaho Falls – To install officers out of time, 35 days having elapsed.

Meridian 66, Meridian – To initiate within two (2) weeks, three (3) days having elapsed.

Crescent 43, Kamiah – To install all officers out of time, 35 days having elapsed.

AMENDMENTS TO BY-LAWS APPROVED

Meridian 66, November 17, 2011

Article II Meetings, Section 1 Amended to read: This Chapter shall hold stated meetings each month on the first Tuesday with the exception of 2 months during the year. (Note: This gives the Worthy Matron flexibility when planning her year to avoid holding a stated meeting on a holiday, such as New Years or in June when our meeting is the night of the last day of Grand Chapter and make these meetings up, so we meet our required 10 meetings, by having a meeting in July or/and August.)

Article IX, Fees and Dues Section 1. Amended to read: The Initiation Fee for membership in this chapter shall be \$80.00 (eighty dollars) which shall accompany the petition. This includes a \$5.00 (five dollar) fee for the International Headquarters Fund.

Article IX, Fees and Dues Section 2. Amended to read: The per annum dues of each member of this chapter shall be \$25.00 (twenty-five dollars) plus the current Grand Chapter per capita.

Ruth 3, March 3, 2012

Article IX, Dues Section. Amended to read: The dues of each member of this chapter shall equal the per capita assessment of the Pocatello Masonic Building Board plus the per capita assessment of the Idaho Grand Chapter plus \$1.00 (one dollar). (Note: This will go into effect in 2013)

We each need to make sure that our own Code and Digest is current. All updates are on the website and can be downloaded. Check to see if your ritual says 2009. If not, you need to buy a new revised edition. In order to do good work, you need the new and current updates.

No annual Treasurer's report

No current By-Laws

No checking in or out of Secret Work

Star Points not holding sign until pass is given

No audit report recorded in the minutes

Gestures not given during lectures

Officers not having a current copy of the Ritual or Code and Digest

Colors not given to Marshal before being presented to the Worthy Patron

Chapter not doing two initiations during the year as required in C&D, Article II, Section 6, Page 38

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

Question 1 Pend d'Oreille Chapter 62: the Treasurer resigned and the WM wanted to know if the Secretary could or herself could sign the checks until a new Treasurer was elected and installed after the summer break.

Answer: I saw no reason that this could not be until the Treasurer was elected and installed in September.

From the Grand Secretary: In regard to members who have not paid their dues by December 31 and are to be suspended: Rules and Regulations, Article IX Dues, Section 2, page 48 states, "Chapter dues extend from January 1 through December 31 of the same calendar year and payable in advance, without notice, and become due on January 1 of each year." Section 4, page 99 goes on, "Any member failing to pay dues on or before December 31 of the same year shall

be suspended from all rights and privileges of membership until reinstated.”

Question 2: Since the Code states that dues extend through December 31 and can be paid on December 31, shouldn't suspension occur on January 1 of the immediately following year?

Answer: That to me would be the common sense thing to do. You can still pay your dues on the 31st so how could you be dropped on the same day.

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS SUBMITTED TO JURISPRUDENCE

1. Seconds on a motion: I had written up as an irregularity that the name of the person who seconds a motion should be listed in the minutes. I received an email from the Grand Secretary asking for clarification on this as other WGMs had also written it up. The email she forwarded states: “I have been looking through the Code and Digest trying to find where it says we have to record the name of the person who seconds a motion in a meeting. I have been researching on line that very same thing.

According to <http://www.parlipro.org/minutes.htm>

- All main motions (except such as were withdrawn) and motions that bring a main question again before the assembly, stating the wording as adopted or disposed of, and the disposition-including temporary disposition (with any primary and secondary amendments and adhering secondary motions then pending;
- Secondary motions not lost or withdrawn where needed for clarity of the minutes;
- Previous notice of motions;
- Points of order and appeals, and reasons the chair gives for the ruling;
- Time of adjournment.

Generally the name is recorded of the mover, but not the seconder, unless ordered by the assembly. When corrections to the minutes are made by the assembly, the corrections

are made in the written text of the minutes being approved, and the minutes of the meeting where they are corrected merely a routine motion state that the minutes were approved “as corrected”, without actually stating the details of those corrections.

And the part of the minutes dealing with a routine motion might note that a particular motion was “moved by Ann and passed unanimously.” It is not necessary to include the name of the person who seconds a motion.

Both of these references state the seconder is not named. Our Code states that we are to conform to the Roberts Rules of Order Newly Revised. The first website is that very thing.

Answer: There is nothing in the General Grand Chapter Red Book, requiring recording the name of the person making a second to a motion.

There is nothing in the Idaho Code and Digest requiring the name of the person making a second. Both of these require that we follow Robert’s Rules of Order.

ROBERT’S RULE OF ORDER, The Modern Edition, ARTICLE X, Officers and Boards, Sec.51, Secretary and Minutes, state the following:

“The minutes should not contain the names of seconds of motions, the Secretary’s opinions on matters, any withdrawn motion, the proceedings in a committee of the whole, or a summary of the remarks of a guest speaker.” Therefore, Jurisprudence recommends that the Secretary should not record the name of the member making a second to a motion.

2. Question regarding VPLMs from Denise Hunt, Grand Secretary. Referring to Article XVII Membership, Section 3B, page 57, “If the member holds dual membership in two chapters within the jurisdiction of Idaho, VPLM must be paid in the Primary Chapter before the Secondary Chapter.”

Here is the history:

A member of Valley 74, Cascade holds a VPLM in that chapter. She becomes a dual member of Meridian 66. Valley Chapter is her primary chapter.

Valley Chapter merged with Mizpah 6, Horseshoe Bend, on 1/7/2010. With the merger, all VPLMs held in Valley Chapter transferred to Mizpah Chapter. Mizpah Chapter is now this member’s primary chapter.

This member requested a demit from Mizpah Chapter

which was granted 11/4/2010. The VPLM stayed with Mizpah Chapter because she could not afford to pay the difference it cost to transfer the VPLM. Meridian Chapter is now her primary chapter.

In January, 2012 the same member submitted a Petition for Affiliation to Mizpah Chapter's secretary. This is the proper procedure according to Article XV, Section 5, page 54: "A demitted member may petition the Chapter from which the demit was granted for affiliation." However, since this member is a member of the Meridian Chapter, I instructed the chapter secretary to obtain a Petition for Dual Membership, instead. The circumstance referred to in the Code is for the member who is not a member of another chapter.

Following the progression of this member's involvement in her chapters, it seems logical that her primary chapter would remain Meridian Chapter and Mizpah Chapter would become her secondary chapter. But, the Code states that a VPLM must be paid in the primary chapter before the secondary chapter. Does the existence of the VPLM in Mizpah Chapter cause Mizpah Chapter to become her primary chapter again?

There is another reason this matters and that is for statistical reasons. The chapter secretaries must account for the dual members in their chapters. Further, they must report whether these dual members are primary or secondary dual members. So, there are two reasons the two chapter secretaries and I must know how to report this one member.

Answer: The majority of Jurisprudence agrees that Meridian 66 is the Primary Chapter. Without paying the difference in the dues rate the VPLM will stay with Mizpah 6.

The month ended with my journey north of the border on May 26th to attend the British Columbia and Yukon Grand Chapter Session in Kamloops. I was honored to give the response on behalf of the Distinguished Guests, and to carry the American Flag during their Cavalcade of Flags.

During the Schools of Instruction this year I focused on the proper presentation of the American flag, the duties of the Warder and Sentinel during balloting, and the importance of fully instructing new members in Ritual procedures to preclude any possible embarrassment to them. I also presented some ideas that many have found helpful in memorizing ritual work.

My message during the Official Visits focused on the importance of memorizing our Ritual parts to the best of our ability. Simply put, our Ritual's worth does not just rest on reading and understanding the written word; it rests on movement from the head to the heart to accomplish the purpose for which it was truly intended: to teach our philosophy and to transform the character of those practicing it. The support of the Grand Officers, past and present, throughout the year, the efforts put forth by the WMs and WPs in preparing for the Schools and Visits, the work of the members and pro-tems, helped make these occasions a Treasured Memory, and contributed greatly to my

wonderful journey.

I received many honors and gifts during the year, and enjoyed many wonderful meals. Several gifts, however, really stood out. I would like to thank Brother Glenn Kinloch for the lighted and motorized Eastern Star shaped UFO, Sister Jane Simmons for the "Take Me to Bob" alien, and Brother Gene Foster for the clothing accessory with a somewhat tenuous connection to lowland dress. **Board of Trustees
Partial Report
2011-2012**

The members of the Board of Trustees will be introduced when we give our final report before the close of this session. We held three meetings since elected. The first meeting was on June 7th at the close of Grand Chapter at the Double Tree in Boise; the second meeting held August 8, 2011 at the Masonic Lodge in Horseshoe Bend; and our last at Nez Perce Masonic Hall in Lewiston on February 25, 2012. There was a lot of business discussed during the year via e-mail between the Board members and the Line Officers.

At the last meeting in Lewiston the contract with the (Double Tree) now Riverside in Boise was signed for 2014. The contract was the same as the one for last year. The contract for 2015 is still pending but will be in Idaho Falls.

The financial issues with the General Arrangements Committee checking account, was resolved. Per the Code and Digest the Board of Trustees is responsible for the \$1,000 (one thousand dollars) used by this committee, and thus a separate account turned over between committee chairs is illegal. The checking account may remain open but must be turned back into the Board and then reissued after session closes.

The major expenditure for the Board was the purchase of a new computer, docking station and monitor for the Grand Secretary. The 1997 Dell she was using could not be up graded any further.

We wish to thank the Grand Secretary Denise Hunt, for her diligent efforts and guidance with the transition of the new Grand Treasurer John Snodderley. The entire Board learned during this process and it was successful on many planes.

The proposed budget is included with this report and it is hoped that you will take time and review the proposed income and expenses of the Grand Chapter. There are several changes in accounts names.

Additional information will be included in the Final Report of the Board of Trustees.

Australia: The United Grand Chapter of Australia met for its 13th Biennial "Take Time" Session in Brisbane, Queensland, June 8-12, 2011. Lois Allen, MWGM presided with James Beck, MWGP. Australia has five Grand Chapters and 97 chapters with 3,060 members as of March 11, 2011. Vicki Chamberlain, Grand Representative of Australia in ID and her escort, John Chamberlain attended.

Resumes were submitted by those seeking elective offices. These resumes included things such as personal and family information, educational and career history, community service and youth involvement, Eastern Star history and offices held.

California had 28,462 members as of June 30, 2011, of which 5,290 are Golden Stars. 1,065 registered attendees were at Grand Chapter, including 67 first timers and a service dog. Apparently there is some discord among several of the chapters, three of which were in probation and monitored quarterly, and all members were reminded of the obligation taken at the altar, which according to both the WGM and WGP, many have forgotten. MWGM Rennie Ofton attended, as did RWAGM Bobbie White who addressed the attendees on behalf of GGC. WGEster Linda Hatrick, PGM of Idaho, was introduced. Jennifer McKinney was the Grand Representative of ID in OK but did not attend Grand Chapter. Oklahoma had 10,294 members distributed among 119 chapters at the end of 2009. 123 distinguished guests from 27 states and one Canadian province were among the 496 registered attendees, representing 86 Oklahoma chapters. During the session, 23 50-year members and five 60-year members were introduced. Oklahoma lost 228 members over the past year, including one PGP and an 88-year member who passed away at age 110. Of the 119 chapters in Oklahoma, six have the same names of those in Idaho: Ada, Electa, Mizpah, Queen Esther, Harmony, and Ruth. The 103rd session will be entitled "Gathering of the

Jewels” with Beverly Boyett, WGM and Rohn Hall, WGP. All appointments, representatives, and pages are announced after installation of the new officers.

Oregon: “Bee Happy . . . Make Memories” was the theme of the 121st Annual Session of the Grand Chapter of Oregon held in Pendleton June 20-23, 2010. WGM Rebecca Price presided with WGP Joseph Jarvis. Attendance totaled 413 members plus 128 out-of-state visitors. Oregon has 73 chapters and 6,810 members. Nineteen Idaho members were introduced: GGCCM Chapter Restoration Joanna Davidson, WGM Christy Schill-Newbold, WGP Larry Allen, PGM Nancy Ross, PGP Art Shoemaker, AGM Sandi Shoemaker, AGP Bob Barclay, GC Karen Juell, AGC Sue Warner, GMarshal Susan Snodderley, GElecta Gladys Allen, GChaplain WA John Chamberlain, GMarshal OR Carolyn Patrick, Grand Representative of OR in ID Lovena Bills, Grand Representative of Australia in ID Vicki Chamberlain, Grand Representative of NY in ID Delta Holloway, Queen, Iras Temple, Daughters of the Nile Peggy Gautschi, and Queen, El Karnak Temple, Daughters of the Nile Peggy Miller. Among the topics of discussion was the concern over a loss of thirty chapters and 4,500 members in the past ten years that has created a financial crisis. The special projects were Cancer Research, the Home Endowment, Heart Fund, Youth, Shrine Transportation, Scottish Rite Learning Clinics, and the Knights Templar Eye Foundation. WGM Connie Harris and WGP Garrett Cooke presided over the 122nd Grand Chapter in Pendleton in June 2011.

Oregon held its “Our Living Story” Annual Session in Pendleton on June 19-22, 2011. Connie Harris, WGM and Garrett Cooke, WGP presided. Oregon has 71 chapters and a membership of 6,370. All chapters were represented at Grand Chapter and a total of 474 members and visitors attended. The Special projects raised \$12,577 for the Shrine patient transportation, Scottish Rite Learning clinics, The Heart Fund, and Youth Fund. Idaho members introduced were WGM Sandi Shoemaker, WGP Bob Barclay, PGMs and PGPs Mary Lynne Nealis, Christy Schill-Newbold, and Art Shoemaker, Grand Officers Sue Warner GC, Valerie Aikin-Sievers GChaplain, Goldie Brian GRuth, Brenda Cox GEsther, Judy DuClercque GMartha, Delta Holloway GElecta and Glenn Kinloch GWarder, Hudson Shake Grand Representative of OR in ID and Lois Jones UT in ID. The 123rd “Visioners” Annual Session will be presided over by Carolyn Beecher WGM and Don Gay

WGP on June 18-21, 2012 in Pendleton.

Hudson Shake is the Grand Representative of OR in ID and has enjoyed visits to Baker City, Vale, Nyssa and Ontario. He met and visited with his counterpart, Herold Reid from Milton-Freewater at the Oregon Grand Chapter in 2011. Being about the same age, they had lots in common to visit about; especially since Herald had attended Emmett High School and Hudson had attended Payette High School at the same time. They had played in football games against each other, and each graduated in 1939. Wow! Lots of stories, very interesting and fun. Hudson is very honored to be the Grand Representative of OR in ID. We are so glad he is enjoying the friendship!

Pennsylvania: The 117th Grand Chapter session, "Joy is the Music of Angels," was held in York on June 20-22, 2011. Paula Kauffman was WGM and John Berger was WGP. The WGM's emblem was music notes and her fun emblem was the music box. The officers entered the chapter room through a black 12' tall archway shaped like a grand piano. Their special project for the year was KIDS (Kindness Inspires Dreams of Success), a children's home at the Masonic Village in Elizabethtown, which celebrated its 100th anniversary during the year. WGP presented the home with \$93,383. Robert C. Penoyer, PA PGP, is the RWGSentinel, but did not attend the session. However, AMWGP John G. Grobler did attend. Other General Grand Chapter Officers attending were RWAGM Bobbie White, RWGC Helen Westmoreland, RWAGC Marianne Shenefelt. In addition, RWGTrustees Paula Argus and Betty Briggs, also attended. Ruth Holland was the Grand Representative to Idaho, but did not attend. Joan Heisch was Idaho's Grand Representative to Pennsylvania, but did not attend. During their worship service over 1,000 partook of the Sacrament of Holy Communion. During the year, PA lost 1,197 members, including two Past Grand Matrons, two Past Grand Patrons, and the chairman of the grand session. The Grand Chapter owns cemetery lots located throughout the state, many purchased for the Eastern Star homes located in Pittsburg and Philadelphia. These lots are available to members and their families on a donation basis. PA had 178 of their 185 chapters represented at Grand Chapter. PA has 31,234 members, of which only 1,756 are male. Through the sale of music box pins, the Grand Chapter presented a check for \$88,135 to the Multiple Sclerosis foundation of PA. PA Grand Chapter has

raised over \$1.3M for MS since 1999. OES was awarded the outstanding fundraising group of the year. By selling flags for Patriots, scarves, ties, and pins, OES also presented a check for \$125,703 for Service Dogs for PA Veterans. The 188th session will be held in York June 18-20, 2012.

Quebec: Quebec's 88th "Ode to Life" Annual Session was held in Granby on October 14-15, 2010 with Huguette Daguerre, WGM and Armand Lono, WGP presiding. Quebec has eleven chapters and 441 members. There were 116 members and 100 distinguished guests attending the annual session. \$1,120 was given to the Shrine Hospital Wish List, the WGM's Special Project. Quebec has a special committee that over sees the translation of the new ritual into the French language. The 89th Annual Session will be held October 13-14, 2011 in Granby. WGM Fabienne Winter and WGP Eric Sanborn will preside.

Vicki Straw is Idaho's Grand Representative to Quebec. She and her counterpart haven't communicated very much, but Vicki received a very nice letter from her about a month ago. Heather had been very ill last year and took a while to recuperate from surgery. She and her husband own a farm and do about the same as Vicki and her husband do - raise hay and cattle. Vicki thinks their operation is much smaller, but it's all hard work! Vicki has a photo of her and her husband when she received her 50 year pin. What an accomplishment. Heather loves to quilt and does so for grandchildren. Heather would have liked to have attended Idaho's Grand Chapter, but won't be able to make it this year. Vicki will continue to keep in touch with Heather, even after her appointment is up this year. And, Vicki would like so much to be a Grand Representative again. Sounds like you are a wonderful Grand Representative Vicki!

Rhode Island: The "Love Works Magic" Session of the Grand Chapter of Rhode Island was held Oct. 8-9, 2010, with WGM Barbara A. Page and WGP Manuel Arruda presiding. There were 98 members and 68 visitors in attendance. Rhode Island has nine chapters and 1,131 members. During the term, an Eastern Star Ball was held. A special committee called Save Our Star was formed. The purpose was stopping internal fighting, working out closer relationships with Masonic Lodges, and reaching out to Majority Members of Rainbow for Girls. While the committee was allocated money, it did not feel comfortable spending it and instead suggested a formal marketing program. The Grand Chapter awarded \$6,500

in scholarships and supported a number of charitable and fraternal organizations.

Saskatchewan: The Grand Chapter of Saskatchewan held the 95th Annual Session in Moosejaw on April 28-30 2011. WGM Bev Otsuka and WGP Maurice Casavant presided over their "Shoot for the Stars" Session. Saskatchewan has 1,347 members and 18 chapters. There were 247 members and visitors who attended the session. The WGM's and WGP's Special Project was autism; the WGP's grandson had been diagnosed just before he became WGP. They raised \$2,606 for their Autism Project. The 96th session will convene on April 26-28, 2012 in North Battlefield with Mary Heskett, WGM and Gerald Busch, WGP presiding.

South Carolina: Dave Wyatt was appointed Grand Representative of South Carolina in Idaho this year, and just recently received a letter from his counterpart in South Carolina. Dave has replied, and their friendship is just getting started. Stay tuned for more.

South Dakota: The 132nd Grand Chapter was held in Pierre October 7-9, 2010. Pat Conger-Sweaney, WGM, and Larry Hornstra, WGP presided over the "Garden of Roses" Session. Mary Ann Erickson was the Grand Representative of ID in SD. She was introduced and gave the response for the Grand Representatives. Elizabeth Baker was Idaho's Grand Representative of SD in ID, but did not attend. MWGM Rennie Ofton attended and addressed the session attendees. South Dakota had 3,491 members distributed among fifty chapters. There were 82 distinguished guests among the 411 registered attendees. During the year, South Dakota lost 136 members, including three PGPs. Of the fifty chapters in South Dakota, three have the same names of those in Idaho: Crescent, Mizpah, and Adah. This year's special project was ACTS (Assisting Children to Smile), which has been the official Eastern Star Project since 2005. During the session 57 50-year members were introduced, twenty 60-year members, three 65-year members, two 70-year members, and one 80-year member. The 133rd session will be held October 6-8, 2011 in Pierre with WGM Teri Parlet and WGP Jack Frantz. Their theme will be "Random Acts of Kindness," with a motto of "One can make a difference, Embrace your dreams, and Share your love." They will be supporting the GLAHM (Good Life and Healthy Mind) camp for teen paraplegics within the Shrine Hospital system by selling Flamingo pins.

Donna Howard is the Grand Representative of SD in ID. Donna is thrilled to death to be Grand Representative. She has sent a thank you card to the WGM of South Dakota and the WGM of Idaho for her appointment. Donna also sent a welcome letter to her counterpart, Vivian, along with an invitation to our Grand Chapter and a special project pin. She has not heard back from Vivian, but is planning to attend their Grand Chapter. Safe travels Donna.

Tennessee: Tennessee held its 110th "Golden Chain of Friendship" Grand Session in Memphis on April 17-19, 2011. Johnnie Mae Bixler served as WGM and Temple Pugh served as WGP. Tennessee has 177 chapters and a membership of 17,692.

Tennessee supports many projects including Scholarship, Arthritis, Cancer and Heart. There were 16 members who made more than 100 visitations during the year and they were recognized and it was interesting to note that the membership made a total of 47,600 visits to other chapters during the year. The 111th Annual Session will be held in Kingsport April 18-20, 2012 with Carnen Ricker, WGM and Lowell Gregg, WGP presiding.

Sondra Cullen is very pleased that she has been in contact with her counterpart, Georgia Wilson. She had the opportunity to meet Georgia in April when she attended Tennessee Grand Chapter and had a delightful time. Southern hospitality is truly what they say it is. Sondra was very honored to be asked by the hostess of the Grand Representatives luncheon to give the response to the welcome. Wow! Three other members of Esther Chapter #14 traveled with Sondra to Tennessee (and I hear they had a great time!)

Texas: The Grand Chapter of Texas held its 128th "Love and Friendship Across Texas" Session in Amarillo Aug. 5-7, 2010. WGM Bess Caldwell presided with WGP Bill Wyatt. Attendance totaled 1,776. Texas has 392 chapters and 33,841 members. The WGM's and WGP's "Gifts as Big as Texas" program raised \$61,913 for the Texas Masonic Retirement Center, EXtra Money for the General Fund, Benevolent Aid and Educational Scholarships. Members passed an amendment limiting chapters to two raffles per year to be in compliance with state law. An amendment to allow women to wear ankle length non-denim trousers to meetings was defeated. The 129th Grand Chapter session was in Houston Aug. 8-10, 2011 with WGM Mary Ruth White and WGP Karl

Drescher Jr. presiding.

Vermont: Vermont's 139th "On the Wings of Love" Session was held in South Burlington June 2-4, 2011. Kathleen Sjolander presided as WGM and Alex Porter as WGP. Vermont has a membership of 2,499 members and 37 chapters. The WGM and WGP had the Make a Wish Foundation as their special project and were able to give \$11,983 to this project. There was a total of 319 members and visitors who attended the session. The 140th "Prism of Light" Annual Session will be held in Burlington on June 8-10, 2012 with Patty Rousseau, WGM and Richard Backus, WGP presiding.

Fran Linn just received her appointment as Grand Representative to Vermont in January during Adah Chapter 8's Official Visit. Fran immediately sent a letter to her counterpart, Vincent Comegno, who lives in Jericho. She also sent a thank you to WGM Sandi Shoemaker for her recommendation, a thank you to the Grand Secretary of Vermont, and the WGM of Vermont for the appointment. The Grand Chapter Session of Vermont is June 9-12, 2012, so Fran won't likely be able to attend both Idaho Grand Chapter and Vermont Grand Chapter at the same time. Fran has corresponded with Vincent twice and his wife (Daryl) once. The last time she heard from them was when they informed her that their chapter was closing their doors and that Vincent was demitting from Eastern Star. It was such a disappointment.

Virginia: Virginia held the 106th Annual Session in Hampton, May 17-19, 2010. Presiding over the "Infinite Flight of Our Stars" Annual Session were Georgia Jett, WGM and Donald Phillips, WGP. Virginia has 126 chapters and 10,353 members. There were 369 members and visitors attending the session. Of interest Virginia gives out a plaque to any chapter that increases its membership by at least one new member and a bar to go on the plaque every year the chapter continues to increase membership by initiation; and 24 chapters received this award. The WGM's and WGP's special project Cancer and Fisher House, the Veterans home of Virginia, raised a total of \$20,390. The 107th Annual Session will be held in Hampton on May 16-18, 2011. WGM Bren Brundage and WGP David Bland will preside.

Jennifer Marshall left to attend Virginia's Grand Chapter on May 19, 2012. We hope you had a great time Jen!

Washington: The Grand Chapter of Washington held its 123rd “Follow the Stars” Session in Yakima June 27-29, 2011 with Linda Runyan, WGM and Richard “Dick” Weigel, WGP. The WGM’s special project was cancer research, and the WGP’s special project was diabetes research. Washington had 92 chapters, and all 92 were represented at Grand Chapter, with 741 voting delegates and approximately 300 guests. AMWGP and PGP of Washington, John Grobler attended, as did RWAGM Bobbie White. Idaho’s WGM Sandi Shoemaker and WGP Bob Barclay were introduced. Other Idaho attendees were PGMs Yvonne Wilbur and Christy Shill-Newbold, PGP’s Art Shoemaker and Larry Allen, GC Sue Warner, GMarshal Peggy Miller, GEsterh Brenda Cox, GElecta Delta Holloway, GOrganist Ed Simmons, and GWarder Glenn Kinloch.

Jeannette Carroll was the Grand Representative to Idaho, and carried the Idaho flag in during the parade of flags, escorted by Arlene Kolar, the Grand Representative of WA in ID. During the year, Washington issued 139 50-year memberships and one 75-year membership. 43 resolutions were read and voted on. Washington lost 423 members, including three PGMs and one PGP. The 124th session will be held June 25-27, 2012 in Yakima with Gloria Schwatz, WGM and Frank Pascoe, WGP.

Wisconsin: Wisconsin had the 119th “Ripples of Joy” Grand Session at Stevens Point on May 18-20, 2010 with Bobbi Jo Oyen, WGM and Jim Sedall, WGP presiding. Wisconsin has a membership of 5,132 members and 67 chapters. UW Carbone Thyroid Cancer Research and Wisconsin Alzheimer’s Institute were the Special Projects of the WGM and WGP. Wisconsin raised \$10,372 for these two projects. The 120th Grand Session will be held in Madison on May 17-19, 2011. WGM Rosie Fiscus and WGP George Winget will preside.

Wyoming: Allen Simmons got his Grand Representative appointment at Soda Springs’ Official Visit. After looking at the schedule for the WGM/WGP of Wyoming, he noticed that the Official Visit of his counterpart was in March. So, he emailed the WGM and asked if she had presented the appointment to his counterpart. She said that she was going to present it at their Official Visit in March, so Allen went to Green River, WY and attended his counterpart’s Official Visit. When Linda, his counterpart, was presented with her commission, WGM Julie said that she had another surprise for her. She then introduced Allen to Linda. Allen will be attending Linda’s installation as WM of Mystic Chapter 8 in Green River, WY on June 7th, and then will hustle back to Idaho for our Grand Chapter.

FINAL REPORT OF THE GENERAL ARRANGEMENTS COMMITTEE

Suzanne Buchan, PM (21) Chairman: The Grand Chapter of Idaho's "Treasured Memories Session" was held at the Shilo Inn in Idaho Falls June 8 through June 12, 2012.

The contract which had been negotiated with the hotel and convention center by the Board of Trustees assured us of the full usage of the facility at no additional charge if we met the required minimum of meals served. Fortunately we did meet the minimum as negotiated. We were also pleased that the Catering Department was able to accommodate many late reservations for meals that came in during the session. These additional meals helped us bring in a net profit from meals of \$383.59. As a special note, due to the great planning by Meals Chairman Johannah Grant, the meals of the WGM, WGP, Gr. Secretary, Gr. Treasurer and the meals of the Tellers were covered by the committee's budget and a bill will not be submitted to Grand Chapter.

We started with a checkbook balance of \$1,100 which was seed money from Grand Chapter and one chapter refund check from the 2011 General Arrangements Committee which was never cashed. We also asked each of the thirteen Hostess Chapters to send in \$100 additional seed money. This gave us a beginning balance of \$2,400.

The expenses we incurred other than meals were rental of photo risers (\$250), piano moving and tuning (\$150), decorations and printing supplies (\$308.22), meal refunds (\$68), bank charges (\$6).

Each of the Hostess Chapters has been reimbursed the \$100 seed money they supplied.

The General Arrangements account balance of \$1,483.59 will now be sent to Grand Chapter. Betty Ringquist did a great job of keeping our finances in check and has submitted her final report.

The arrangements with the hotel division of the Shilo Inn granted us "comped" rooms depending on the number of guests staying at their facility. We had 104 reservations made in the name of Idaho Grand Chapter for a total of 353 "nights". This did not fully cover the cost of the rooms for the WGM, WGP, Gr. Secretary and Gr. Treasurer. We did have to pay a portion of their charges (\$559.35). This cost was paid by Grand Chapter. The hotel did however give us the usage of the Hospitality Room and the area used by the Vendors (including all of the set up) at no additional charge. Joanne Galbraith,

Housing Chairman, did a great job coordinating all of the guests and their special needs and requests.

We only had two outside vendors this year. All contract money from these vendors was paid to the Grand Chapter.

A few suggestions/notes for the 2013 General Arrangements Committee and the Board of Trustees:

We suggest that the tradition of Hostess Chapters supplying seed money is not necessary. The amount of income generated from the meals seems sufficient to cover the additional expenses.

We were told that there are two arches in the trailer. Actually there are only parts of two arches and they do not match. Most WGMs ask to use an arch for their entrances.

We secured two wheelchairs to use during the session to assist members. One member used one the entire time to get back and forth from the room. The second chair was used periodically. It would be helpful if at least one chair was part of the trailer supplies.

The Hotel only had an electric piano that could be rented. We were fortunate that we were able to borrow one from a local church. The cost of renting one from a local piano company was going to be \$450 for the session. Some Grand Organists require a traditional piano and not an electric model. This needs to be discussed with them.

We had to borrow two steps to be used at both podiums for our shorter members. This would also be helpful to have as an item in the trailer.

We made a donation to the local high school for the use of their choir's risers for our photos. There were none available to rent in our area. Plus, giving the money to the choir instead of a business seemed like a positive thing to do.

The fabric hangings used in the East in the star point colors are stored and can be used by future committees.

We did not incur any costs in supplying the tote bags.
